- Connecting people to resources such as inpatient treatment, vital document assistance, low-income housing, transitional living, and/or other services needed to help achieve housing goals




## **Cold Weather Plan Summary**

80 All Gender 152 Men 112 Women 6 Families +100 additional on level 4	Different locations meet the needs of all populations	Every staff member will receive the same multi-course training	Food will be offered to all sites by one centralized entity. Some locations will choose to manage their own food program.	Practices across all 10 sites for equitable access and treatment
